Multi-Disciplinary Urban Design Studios

Design studios are inherently collaborative. Organization of a multi-discipline design studio is an important addition to any community. Design studios can be sponsored by academic institutions such as the Cleveland Urban Design Collaborative described below; or the Chattanooga Design Studio which is "an independent non-profit community resource that promotes excellence in urban design through education, facilitation, and collaboration."

Urban design studios accessible by the public, by special interest groups, by the city and others adds a dimension to the forward thinking design of the city. Organization of a "public" urban design center is an available activity of any small city. Collaboration with a college, university, institution or regional agency helps.
