## **Neighborhood Favorites**

Walk, hike or bike the 1.3 mile Museum Reach for views of unique public art including an exhibit called "F.I.S.H." that includes 27 sunfish swimming in the sky under the I-35 overpass near Camden Street. Visit the San Antonio Museum of Art, known for its collection of ancient Mediterranean, Asian, and Latin American art. Grab a light bite at Ocho in Hotel Havana for pan-Latin influences, dine al fresco at The Luxury, a walk-up restaurant inside a cargo container that serves sandwiches and craft beers, visit the VFW Post on the river front, or wander through the Japanese Tea Garden and eat at the Jingu House Café. Experience the St. Mary's Strip, a cultural hub of nightlife, food and entertainment. Make time for a visit to the city's lodging gem, Hotel Emma, while visiting the eateries, bars and shops at Pearl.
