Kevin Lynch is one of the all-time best contributors to the art and science of city design. *The Image of The City, published in 1960*, contains many terms and ideas that are now clichés. He developed theory and language based on his study of three towns: Boston, Jersey City and Los Angeles. He, like other urban planners in the 1950s and 1960s, laid the ground for contemporary approaches. Even though conditions in the 21<sup>st</sup> century are quite different than those of post WWII, their ideas remain useful.

Kevin Andrew Lynch (January 7, 1918 – April 25, 1984) was an American <u>urban planner</u> and author. He is known for his work on the perceptual form of urban environments and was an early proponent of <u>mental mapping</u>. His most influential books include <u>The Image of the City</u> (1960), a seminal work on the perceptual form of urban environments, and *What Time is This Place?* (1972), which theorizes how the physical environment captures and refigures temporal processes.


A student of architect <u>Frank Lloyd Wright</u> before training in city planning, Lynch spent his academic career at the <u>Massachusetts Institute of Technology</u>, teaching there from 1949 to 1978. He practiced <u>site planning</u> and <u>urban design</u> professionally with Carr, Lynch, and Sandell.

Mr. Lynch lists his elements of the city along with a concise definition of each.

- 1. Paths,
- 2. Edges,
- 3. Districts,
- 4. Nodes, and
- 5. Landmarks.

The elements offer an organizing framework still useful in the post-urbanist world. He relates these to three towns which demonstrates his thought process and offers a nostalgic look at the three towns in their heyday of the 1950s.
